Founded in 1924, the Faculty of Economics and Management Sciences' (FACEA) mission is excellence in research and teaching at the graduate and undergraduate levels in economics and management, under the ethical inspiration of the Catholic faith. FACEA seeks to develop economists, managers, and entrepreneurs with an analytical mind, qualified to perform in today's complex and global environment.

The Faculty disposes of approximately 59 full-time professors, who have graduate studies specializing in economics or administration in the most prestigious American and European universities. Also, every year the Faculty receives well-known visiting and collaborating professors from Chile and abroad.

The undergraduate student body is comprised of approximately 1,500 students.

The Faculty of Economics and Management Sciences has maintained a deep commitment to academic research in economics and management since the mid sixties, when sound policy making in economics and management practices required applied studies. At present, faculty members have research lines in a wide variety of subjects, among which are capital markets, privatization, deregulation, pension funds, natural resource and environmental policy, economic integration, macroeconomics, health economics, globalization, labor relations, production scheduling and

logistics, marketing, and ethics in management. This work has been published in international and Chilean journals, books, working papers, etc.

The Institute's underlying and constant objective is to achieve for its members (both students and professors) not only a solid command of economic theory, but also the ability to apply it to the understanding of the nation's economic problems and to propose feasible solutions.

Since 2002, the Institute imparts the Doctorate in Economics program. Its objective is to offer an excellent education in economic science and educate high level professionals, capable of participating in teaching and research activities, both in universities and in investigation centers. The Institute also offers a dual Master's in Economics degree with Tilburg University and Paris Dauphine.

Another program is the Interamerican Applied Macroeconomics Program (PIMA), which since 1990 offers a curriculum leading to the diploma "Specialist in Applied Macroeconomics". The program has enjoyed the support of the Interamerican Development Bank and of several
