The University's academic activities are carried out by the Faculties, which are subdivided into Schools or Institutes and these into departments, programs or work groups. The Faculties' statutes and the University's regulations determine the functions of the Dean of each Faculty and the responsibilities of the Faculty Council, with which the Dean works. The procedures for selecting officials vary from one Faculty to another, depending on their respective statutes. Faculty members elect Deans and heads of Schools, Institutes and Departments.
