## **IX. LANGUAGE COURSES**

In order to prepare UC students for studying abroad several language courses are offered in English, French, German, Italian, Japanese, Mandarin Chinese and Catalan in close collaboration with the bilateral cultural and language institutes located in Chile.

## **XI. MINORS IN REGIONAL STUDIES PROGRAM**

The UC offers 58 different academic certificates (Minors) in different fields of study. They consist of 50 core and elective credit programs. Students receive a formal certification when they fulfill the 50 credit requirement.

- 1 Minor in Latin American Studies (includes core and elective courses in Economics, History, Political Science, Literature, Fine Arts, and Sociology)
- 2 Minor in European Studies (includes core and elective courses in Economy, Political Science, Social Sciences, and Law)
- 3 Minor in Asian Studies (includes core and elective courses in Political Science, Geography, History, and Economy)
