programs and promotes these programs in order to recruit the best students of the region.

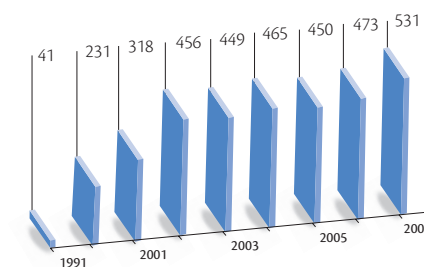
